ABSTRACT

The Competency-Based Dynamic Curriculum (CBDC) mandates the horizontal and vertical integration of basic medical sciences with clinical homoeopathic subjects to enhance diagnostic and therapeutic competency. Homoeopathic Materia Medica (HMM), when synthesized with Anatomy, Physiology, Pathology, and the Practice of Medicine, transcends rote memorization, fostering clinical reasoning. *Arsenicum album*, a polychrest with multi-systemic influence, serves as an archetypal model for integrated learning. This study illustrates a structured pedagogical framework using *Arsenicum album* to correlate drug pathogenesis with clinical disease entities.

- **Necrosis:** Tissue death and malignancy.

Integration under the CBDC model ensures that the homoeopathic physician evolves from a prescriber of symptoms to a scientifically grounded clinician capable of outcome-oriented practice.
